Schedule of Classes and Afternoon and Evening Activities

General Information

1. Classes are held each morning at 45 St Giles. Afternoon and evening activities are held in the E.P. Abrahams Room at **Green College**, Woodstock Road.
2. The Summer Programme Office at 45 St Giles is open for book sales and enquiries from 1-2 PM, Monday to Thursday.
3. Only registered students may attend morning classes. It is regretted that guests cannot under any circumstances be **admitted**. Guests are welcome, however, at afternoon and evening activities, subject to **availability** of space.
4. Students must participate in both halves of the same level of each of the four courses (Yiddish I, II, III and IV). Level-mixing is not permitted.

5. Tape recording of classes is not permitted, but students are welcome to record guest lectures, subject to the lecturer's permission. Professor Praver has asked that his Thursday afternoon lectures *not* be recorded.
6. Smoking is not permitted during classes, afternoon lectures or any other Programme activities.
7. Complimentary coffee and biscuits will be available at 45 St Giles during the morning break, 11-11:30 AM. Weather permitting, these will be served in the back garden.
8. Four Albert E. and Lillian C. Marks Prizes, made available through the generosity of the Albert E. Marks Charitable Trust, will be awarded to the student who writes the best essay or term paper in each of the four classes. The prize is £100 for each of the four winners. Decisions will be made jointly by both teachers of each class. Awards will be announced at the Graduation on Friday, 25 August.
9. Four Amalgamated Bank Prizes, made available through the generosity of the Amalgamated Bank in the City of New York, will be awarded to the student who works hardest and progresses the most in each of the four classes. The prize is £100 for each of the four winners. Decisions will be made jointly by both teachers of each class. Awards will be announced at the Graduation on Friday, 25 August.
